This motion has passed out of the House of Representatives and Senate. It's now on its way to the Governor's desk for final approval. It's truly a shame that numerous requests, related to the Deaf community, have been denied over the years but so much of it is now on its way to the Education Trust Fund to be used against its intended purpose. The AAD and ALRID haven't given up hope and


plan to request meetings with vested parties to stop this from happening again.



The 2011 Southeast Regional Institute on Deafness (SERID) will be held at the Renaissance in Montgomery, AL, October 17- October 19, 2011. SERID focuses on the educational and professional development of individuals who work with consumers who are deaf, deafblind, hard of hearing, and late-deafened. The conference is designed to allow participants to explore cutting-edge principles, strategies, and tools that will enable them to provide accessible services to those they serve. SERID will consist of concurrent sessions, plenary sessions, pre-conference workshops, and exhibits.

About this Call for Proposals: A completed program proposal must be submitted by **March 1, 2011**. The presentation and all related materials must be accessible to persons with disabilities. Captioned videos, scripts for auditory materials, large print and Braille copies should be available. We regret that it is not possible to offer honoraria or to waive registration fees for presenters.

Guidelines for Concurrent Session Presentations (75 minutes): Presentation proposals should address current information and effective practices, strategies, and tools for services provided to Deaf, Deafblind, Hard of Hearing, and Late-deafened, including: **Rehabilitation, Employment, Interpreters, Deaf Studies, Mental Health, Substance Abuse, Visual and Auditory Assistive Technology, Hearing loss, Tinnitus, Hearing Aids, Cochlear Implants.**



